Dogwood District/Authority Award

Information for Applicants

There are approximately 80 Dogwood District Scholarships for our school district in the amount of \$1,000 each - \$500 as an award and \$500 to be applied toward tuition at a post secondary institution.

NOTE: A student can now receive *both* a Dogwood District/Authority Award *and* a Grade 12 Graduation Program Examinations Scholarship.

Qualifications

1. You must achieve a B average (73%) in the specialty area in the grade 10, 11 and 12 years. A specialty is defined as:
Fine Arts: 16 credits in a subject area, with a minimum of 8 grade 12 credits;
Applied Skills: 16 credits in a subject area, with a minimum of 8 grade 12 credits;
Physical Activity: 12 credits in a subject area, with a minimum of 4 grade 12 credits;
Second Languages: 12 credits in a subject area, with a minimum of 4 grade 12 credits.
(See list of specialty areas - secondary apprenticeship students, please see your counsellor for exceptions.)
2. You must have a good record of attitude, behaviour and attendance for grade 12. A Level 3 suspension will result in disqualification. Extended absence, will be reviewed by the Dogwood District /Authority Award Committee.
3. You must be a full-time student; minimum of 20 credits in your grade 12 year. (Exceptions, please see your counsellor.) You must be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident (landed immigrant) as of September 30, 2010.
4. You must successfully complete 80 credits in grades 10, 11 and 12 and qualify for graduation. The minimum average required is a C+ (67%) for grade 12 (based on your final top 16 credits and English 12, Communications 12 or Technical Professional Communications 12.)
5. All course work must be successfully completed by June 30th, 2011.
6. You are required to submit an application form to the committee through your school counsellor (see attached), including the reverse side of the application entitled Project Outline, by October 29th, 2010. Late registrations require special approval by the District Committee.
7. The major project must be specifically designed for the Dogwood District/Authority Award competition. All project work submitted for adjudication, must be started and completed in your grade 12 year. Up to 40% of the time and work may count towards a letter grade. This project should take a minimum of 100 hours. Students are to keep a project journal, including a detailed log of time, dates, materials and pictures where applicable, showing development of their project from beginning to end. Students and their sponsor will be required to sign an agreement stating that the project is their own work, started (after June 30, 2010) and completed in Grade 12.
8. Use of school time for the completion of scholarship projects is permitted as long as regular course work is done on time.
9. All applicants must be willing to perform or display their project at the Fine Arts evening or District Mall display.

Adjudication of Project

- A team of adjudicators will evaluate your project and journal. (Contact your counsellor for the specific date and related expectations.) It is important that all logistics are carefully attended to in preparation for the adjudication day.
- Students are responsible for setting up and taking down their projects.

a) Performance Projects:

Students must supply script and/or music and Project Information Sheet to the counsellor, one week prior to the evaluation. Candidates perform in front of an audience and their adjudicators on the designated date.

Drama Performances: Students will have a maximum time of thirty (30) minutes total, including set-up, performance and strike. Performance must be a minimum of fifteen (15) minutes and a maximum of twenty-five (25) minutes. Drama performances must have copyright approval.

Music Performances: Students will have a maximum time of twenty-five (25) minutes total, including set-up, performance and instrument removal. Performance must be a minimum of ten (10) minutes and a maximum of twenty (20) minutes.

Dance Performances: Students will have a maximum time of twenty-five (25) minutes total, including set-up and performance. Performance must be a minimum of ten (10) minutes and a maximum of twenty (20) minutes.

b) All Other Projects:

Students will be advised of these dates in advance (i.e. Mall Display dates are April 18-19, 2011).

Dogwood District Scholarship Marking System

Final standing is based on the following:

Project	65 percent
School Marks	35 percent

Project:

A minimum score of 40/65 on the project is required.

School Marks - (as of June 2011):

The 35 points for this section are divided into two parts as follows:

- a) 15 marks are calculated from your top 16 credits taken in grade 12 plus English 12, Communications 12 or Technical Professional Communications 12. Your overall average must be C+ (67%).
- b) 20 marks are calculated from your specialty area. For Fine Arts/Applied Skills, the top 16 credits are used to calculate this average (at least 8 credits must be grade 12.) For Physical Activity/Second Languages – 12 credits in a subject area, with a minimum of 4 grade 12 credits. The average from your specialty area must be a "B" (73%) or better.

Dogwood District/Authority Award Recipients

Once the grade 12 final examination results are published, the final standing is determined by mid-September 2011. Recipients will receive a voucher for \$500 and a cheque for \$500 directly from the Ministry of Education in November (allow at least 6 weeks processing time from the Ministry.)
